## Who can take part in the research?



You can take part in the research if you

Have an intellectual disability



• Are 18 years old or over



• Are able to read simple English

**Simple English** means short sentences with words that are not hard.



 Live in Sydney and can come to UNSW to be part of the research



You cannot take part in the research if you

 Have vision problems that stop you from being able to read information in simple English



 Need support from another person to read information in simple English

## What does taking part involve?



Taking part involves answering some questions in person at UNSW.

We will ask you about your age and your gender.

We will also ask you what you know about some health topics.



We will also ask you to read and learn some information in simple English.



We will ask you to come to UNSW to answer questions and read information 2 times.

There will be 1 week in between each time.



For example if you visit us on Monday at 9am the first time, you will visit us a second time on Monday at 9am the next week.



We will ask you about

What you know about some health topics



 What you did to learn the information we asked you to read



You can choose which questions to answer.

You can say no if you do not want to answer a question.



We will ask to record what you say.



It is OK if you do not want us to record.

You can write down your answers instead.



If you do not want to write down your answers, we can take notes instead.



The research will take about 1 hour each time.



If you come to do the research 2 times, it will take 2 hours in total.



We will meet you at UNSW.



The research will happen in a private room.



If you want to, you can bring someone you trust to help you travel to UNSW.

But they cannot help you with the research study.



Each time you will get a \$50 Coles-Myer gift card to say thank you.

You will get a total of \$100 if you do the research both times.

## Do I have to take part?



You only have to take part if you want to.

You can say no.



It is your choice.

No one will be angry if you say no.



Even if you say yes you can change your mind later and stop taking part.

# What will happen to my information?



We will store your information and recordings on our computers.



The computers have a password.

Only we will know the password.



We will put any information you write down on paper on to our computers.

We will keep the papers for 3 months in a locked cabinet.



We will destroy the papers after 3 months so that nobody can see them.



We will store your information and records for 5 years after we write reports about it.



We will keep your information private.

We will not tell anybody your name or where you live.

No one will know it was you who took part.



We will write about what we find out.

If you want we will send you a summary.
