


The story is about the **Disability Royal Commission** and what they said about

We thought about how the Commission learnt what happened to people with intellectual disability.




We thought about important **recommendations** the Commission wrote about preventive health care.

We said it would have been good for the Commission to:


- invite more people with intellectual disability to share about their health care
- meet with people in different places.
- meet with people who do not live in the city
- use the word intellectual disability instead of cognitive disability



This is because people may not know cognitive disability includes intellectual disability.
